PAG Regional Council elects 2018 officers

Pima Association of Governments' Regional Council elected Pascua Yaqui Tribe Vice Chairman Peter Yucupico as 2018 Chair, Tohono O'odham Nation Chairman Edward Manuel as Vice Chair and Tucson Mayor Jonathan Rothschild as Treasurer at its annual meeting today.

Other Regional Council members include Pima County Supervisor Ramón Valadez, Marana Mayor Ed Honea, Oro Valley Mayor Satish Hiremath, Sahuarita Mayor Tom Murphy, South Tucson Mayor Ildelfonso Green and Arizona State Transportation Board Member Michael Hammond, who represents Pima County on the state board.

Officers are elected to serve for a one-year period.
